Although situations may otherwise exist, there are two primary instances that constitute an OCI:

- I. A subcontractor has conflicting roles that might bias their judgment;
- II. A Subcontractor has an unfair competitive advantage.

Examples include:

- The offeror would be put in a position to review its own work product. This would most likely occur when the offeror has an existing contract in the same subject matter as the prospective contract and, under the existing contract, is responsible for reviewing the actions or work product resulting from the prospective contract.
- The offeror has financial, contractual, organizational, or other interests related to the subject of the contract to introduce real or perceived bias or lack of objectivity on the part of the apparently successful offeror.
